SECTION 4 First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person, or never induce vomiting.

Inhalation: Remove the affected person to fresh air. Keep him warm. Keep at rest. If symptoms persist, call medical attention.

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Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing and wash skin with plenty of water, use soap. Do not use solvents or thinners. In case of complaints, get medical attention.

Eye contact: Wash affected eyes for at least 10-15 minutes under running water or with isotonic water (20-30°C), with eyelids held open. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Get medical attention. Continue rinsing during transport.

Ingestion: If swallowed rinse mouth, give to drink plenty of water. If medical treatment is delayed, drink 90-120 ml of 40% alcohol (e.g. liqueur) for an adult. Children should be given 2 ml/kg body weight. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by your doctor. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by your doctor. In case of spontaneous vomiting, the head should be turned down. Get medical attention immediately.

Protection of first-aid person: No individual specifications.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Over-exposure include central nervous system effects, abdominal discomfort, metabolic acidosis, headache and nausea.

If product is inhaled at elevated temperatures or as an aerosol it may irritate the respiratory tract and may cause systemic effects similar to ingestion.

Skin: may be absorbed through the skin.

Repeated contact may de-fat the skin and cause dermatitis.

Causes serious eye irritation.

4.3 Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Treat according to symptoms (decontamination, vital functions), no known specific antidote. May cause symptoms similar to ethylene glycol.

SECTION 5 Fire-fighting measures
